

Orphan Annie No More

Last Spring, a youngish Pitbull/mastiff mix came into the shelter as a stray. Unfortunately, she had heartworm disease, which causes damage to the heart, lungs and arteries and can seriously affect the dog's health if untreated. Other than having heartworm, the shelter staff determined that this dog (now named Annie) was a behaviorally and temperamentally adoptable dog. Staff also thought she would be able to withstand the long and difficult course of heartworm treatment.

Because the treatment is so tough, dogs with heartworm must be kept quiet and not get excited for the two months it takes to eradicate. Ideally, Annie would be fostered by a volunteer with no other dogs or pets. Since no volunteers were available, Annie went to stay at Twin Cedar K9, Margé Blair's training facility, while she received treatment.

Annie tolerated her treatment well during her stay at Twin Cedar K9, and at the end of two months there, she came back to the shelter to find her forever home.

This year we restarted our Adoption Outreach events at various county locations. While at the Tractor Supply adoption event, Annie was adopted by Tractor Supply manager Katie.

Annie quickly became a member of the family, and they all LOVE her. We are so happy Annie is living her best life!



Cat-astrophe

After more than 30 years of cat intake numbers going down, A-PAL is now seeing a dramatic increase in the number of cats and kittens coming to us. We attribute this to COVID 19 and the stopping of spay/neuter surgeries, the nationwide shortage of veterinarians and the high cost of veterinarian services.

Cats are far too good at reproducing with the ability to produce 3 litters of 6 kittens each in a year. Those kittens will become sexually mature and able to produce kittens at about 6 months of age.

So many of the kittens we are getting are from feral mothers or strays. Kind people take in the kittens and often even foster and tame them and then need a place for them to go. What we need most is for the mother cat to be spayed and we are happy to help residents by loaning traps.



We also ask that people who feed these cats understand that they will breed. A-PAL has a FREE FERAL CAT SPAY/NEUTER PROGRAM! Both male and female cats need to be "fixed". Males will wander and fight and spread disease if not neutered. When neutered, they calm down and the bad behaviors like fighting and spraying all go away.

A-PAL LOVES KITTENS!!! We took in this adorable box of kittens, but at one time we had over 170 cats and kittens in care which is a huge strain on our budget, our staff and our great crew of caring volunteers.

His owner's family couldn't take Zeke, so he was surrendered to the Calaveras County shelter. He was very sad there, even though he was much loved by the staff. When Margé Blair's fractured clavicle healed enough to work with big dogs again, she took him into her Second Chance program. Everyone who worked with him at Twin Cedar K9 fell in love with him. After 5 weeks of training there, he got really lucky. One of Marge's clients told some friends about Zeke and they were very interested. A 91 year old woman who used to raise German Shepherds and her daughter came to meet him and fell in love and took him home. It was a match made in heaven!
