Of the **790** wild animals that came through our doors for care, including the birds and fawns from the Butte fire, **426** were released back to the wild. These **109** species ranged from robins to opossums to geese to hawks and more.

With our help, **45** mph is the new lower speed limit on the way to Lake Amador, reducing accidents between wildlife and cars.

61 incredible volunteers did it all with your support and, in so doing, added to the quality of life here in the Gold Country, for people and wildlife. We are nothing without them.
